

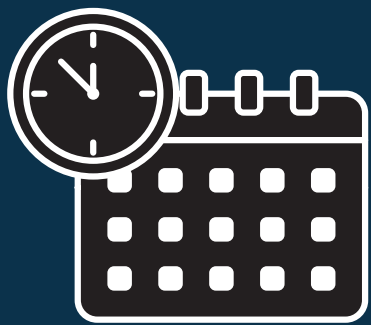

“FAIR AND SUSTAINABLE COST RECOVERY MODEL FOR WATER SECTOR TRANSFORMATION”

Introduction:

Tariffs are based on levels of service established and normally they should be sufficient to provide levels of service, such as water quality, service coverage and pressure at which the service is provided. New capital works and replacement cost are also to be counted in.

The goals of the tariff must be identified in any tariff proposal. Tariff setting goals may consider the following: Financial sustainability; good governance; transparency and predictability; simplicity of the tariff structure, economic efficiency; levels of service that everyone including the poor, deserves or needs and fair pricing.

Appointed as the first Chief Executive Officer of the National Water Services Commission (SPAN) on 1 March 2007 and held the post until 31 August 2014. Prior to that, he served for more than 32 years in the Malaysian civil service in several ministries namely Ministry of Finance, Ministry of Trade and Industry, Ministry of Primary Industries, Ministry of Education, and Ministry of Energy, Water and Communications (MEWC). He last held the position of Deputy Secretary-General responsible for the Energy and Water Sectors of the MEWC before joining SPAN. SPAN is the regulating body formed by the Malaysian Government to enforce the Water Services Industry Act 2006 for Peninsula Malaysia and Federal Territory of Labuan. He played a significant role in the restructuring of the Malaysian water services industry. Water supply services were under various state governments but with the new law, they are now under federal jurisdiction and regulated by SPAN since 2008.

He holds a BA Economics degree (honors) from University of Malaya and an MBA with Advanced Certificate in International Business from New Hampshire College, USA.

Currently, he sits on the Board of Air Selangor as an Independent Director. He is one of the members of the Disciplinary Committee of the Malaysian Bar Council. He was appointed as an advisor for the water series of Informa Markets Malaysia since 2015.
